- In general \$8K seems to be a good planning figure
- However, financial model will be refined to include better facilities and travel estimations; baseline program manager salary will be Rs 2 Lakh/mo
- Add recruiting agency costs of 25%
- In kind contributions
 - Decision taken—none that will justify deduction from dues (same as China model)
 - In kind contribution to projects is an assumption
- Project Update
 - Air Traffic Controller Training—Fiertz
 - The first ACP project was approved for TDA funding.
