Meeting commence on June 10, 2008, at 1600Hrs. Larry Coughlin, Co-Chair Industry addressed the members of ACP and discussed the agenda of the meeting. After that he introduced Dr. Arjun Singh, Program Director of ACP in length and later Dr. Singh shared the experience of the aviation sector as having 25 years experience in Indian aviation sector with different capacity at different airports / Directorates of AAI

- Projects D1 and D3: Pilot and ATCO Capacity Assessment. Draft proposals submitted to ACP. Will review on Wednesday, 06-11-2008, 1600Hrs, at the IACC. Participants:

- Project D2. No proposal. Discussion fixed for Thursday, 06-12 -2008, at 1700 Hrs(IST), via teleconference. Participants:
